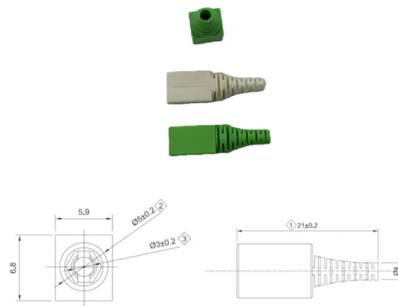


Two cores are extracted from the middle of the optical cable
